With over 27 years of experience in teaching Spanish as a Second Language (ELE) and Spanish literature, Professor Torrecillas is widely recognized across Spain and Europe as a leading teacher trainer. She is affiliated with numerous universities and serves on accreditation committees for foreign language proficiency exams, in addition to being an accredited DELE examiner for the Instituto Cervantes. In this informative session, she shared effective strategies for DELE preparation, offering valuable tips to strengthen vocabulary, grammar, and communicative skills. The online format enabled participation, providing accessible and practical guidance to students preparing for this internationally recognized Spanish proficiency certification.






GUEST LECTURE: ANDALUSIAN CULTURE IN A GLOBALISED SOCIETY

Prof. (Dr.) Antonio Rafael Fernández Paradas, from the Department of Social Sciences Education at the University of Granada, Spain, delivered a thought-provoking lecture on August 6, 2024, exploring the unique cultural identity of Andalusia. He examined how, within a historically stable geographical region, distinct cultural markers have developed over centuries to shape the essence of Andalusian identity. Offering a rich historical and sociocultural perspective, he also addressed how this deeply rooted heritage continues to evolve in response to the dynamics of globalization. The session provided students with valuable insights into the interplay between tradition, identity, and cultural transformation.

LECTURE: CHARACTERISTICS OF CONTEMPORARY SPANISH POETRY

Prof. Juan Carlos Abril from the University of Granada, Spain, delivered an insightful lecture on February 4, 2025, as part of an academic initiative by the Spanish section of the Centre for Foreign Languages. A renowned expert in contemporary Spanish poetry, Professor Abril explored the defining characteristics, central themes, and stylistic innovations that shape modern poetic expression in the Spanish-speaking world. His engaging analysis offered students and faculty a deeper appreciation of the evolution of Spanish poetry and the cultural and literary nuances it embodies.

STUDENT INTERACTION: "ASK-A-GERMAN"

The German section of the Centre for Foreign Languages organized "Ask-a-German" on the 9th October 2024, an infoevent for the students and faculty members who are interested in learning about Germany and its language, history, culture, society etc.

Dr. Michael Stadler, a DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) – Lecturer appointed at the Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, addressed a wide range of topics, providing comprehensive insights into German football, Oktoberfest, the School System of Germany, Cuisine, Dialects etc. He also elaborated on the hobbies that Germans generally pursue in their spare time, differences among different European countries, as well as notable historical facts. A large number of participants attended this event, and they all engaged in the discussions with great enthusiasm and interest. Through this event, we achieved the goal of promoting a more profound understanding of the various dimensions of the German culture and society.

On March 7th 2025, the German section of the Centre for Foreign Languages organized a book talk titled "The Inhuman Empire: Wildlife, Colonialism, Culture" for students and faculty members interested in literature, folklore, colonial studies, and environmental humanities.

Prof. Sadhana Naithani, the author of this book. Prof. Naithani is a renowned Professor of Literature and Folklore at the Centre of German Studies, SLL&CS, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. She is also a former President of the International Society for Folk Narrative Research. In her talk, Prof. Naithani presented critical insights from her book, which examines British writings on Indian wildlife from 1860 to 1960 within the broader framework of colonial rule. She shed light on the contrasting ways in which colonial and folk narratives portray nonhuman animals - the former often reducing them to 'game', while the latter recognize them as sentient beings. Her analysis weaved together hunting accounts, colonial ideology, folklore, and emerging perspectives from anthropology, natural sciences, and philosophy, revealing how narratives reflect and shape our understanding of human-animal relationships. The event was well-attended and stimulated meaningful discussions among participants. It successfully highlighted the intersections of environmental crisis, colonial history, and cultural narratives, while encouraging critical engagement with how we conceptualize nature and wildlife in both historical and contemporary contexts.

GUEST LECTURE: "EXPLORING GERMAN CRAFTSMANSHIP: A JOURNEY THROUGH EUROPEAN ART HISTORY FROM THE 15TH TO THE 20TH CENTURY"


A special guest lecture on the rich history of European Art, with particular emphasis on the contributions of German artists from the 15th to the 20th century was organized in hybrid mode by the German section of the Centre for Foreign Languages on March 25th 2025. Dr. Mercy Vungthianmuang Guite, Assistant Professor at the Centre of German Studies, SLL&CS, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, provided a comprehensive overview of the evolution of art from the Renaissance through the Baroque, Romantic, and Modern periods, culminating in the emergence of abstract art in the 20th century. Dr. Guite highlighted the critical role German artists played in shaping European art movements and traced the cultural and historical contexts in which their work emerged. This engaging lecture drew active participation from students and faculty alike, fostering an appreciation for the historical depth and cultural significance of European and German art traditions. It successfully deepened the audience's understanding of visual culture and its broader intellectual heritage.

On April 7th 2025, the German section of the Centre for Foreign Languages organized a guest lecture titled "Trustworthy AI and Philosophical Ethics" for students and faculty members interested in technology, ethics, and democratic governance. The event took place online.

Prof. (Dr.) Giannis Stamatellos, Professor of Philosophy and President of the Institute of Philosophy and Technology in Athens, Greece, explored the ethical challenges posed by Artificial Intelligence (AI), particularly the need for fairness, democratic access. and the inclusion of diverse stakeholders across the AI lifecycle. A significant part of the talk focused on virtue ethics. Prof. Stamatellos encouraged reflection on the traits that define a "good" student or person. He questioned whether ethical growth requires absolute self-reliance or whether seeking help is a valuable moral trait. These reflections helped personalize the broader debate around human and artificial autonomy. Importantly, the lecture emphasized that ethical AI must uphold human rights and freedoms, actively avoid bias in decision-making, and promote diversity and impartiality. Participants were urged to consider how technology impacts not only institutions but individual autonomy and responsibility.

Faculty SPOTLIGHT


PROF. DR. SHRUTI JAIN, Professor (German) & Director, CFL, continues to make significant contributions to the fields of literature, philosophy, and foreign language education through her research, publications, and academic engagement.

- Her book chapter titled "The Snail and its House: Anneliese as a Home Thinker in Lou Andreas-Salomé's Das Haus" was published In September 2024 in a Scopus-indexed edited volume by Bloomsbury, offering a nuanced exploration of domesticity, space, and identity in Salomé's writing.
- On 1st October 2024, she was invited to a Kafka centenary panel discussion at Ashoka University, where she reflected on the often-overlooked influence of Kafka's mother in his literary imagination.
- On 10th October 2024, Dr. Jain delivered a talk titled "Revisiting the Future: Nietzschean Perspectives in/and Indian Thought" at the GLOBAL CONFERENCE ON NIETZSCHE'S FUTURES organized by the prestigious Nietzsche Kolleg/Klassik Weimar Stiftung, Weimar, Germany, illustrating the contemporary Indian reception of Nietzsche's thought.
- She conducted a Masterclass for students at the Amity School of Foreign Languages, Noida, on 23rd November 2024, focusing on interactive and learner-centered strategies in foreign language pedagogy.
- Most recently, on 26th April 2025, Dr. Jain led a national online workshop organized by InDAF (Indo-German Teachers' Association) for German language teachers across India on the Role of Discursivity in Teaching Culture in the Foreign Language Classroom, foregrounding the importance of critical cultural discourse in language
