The report's findings are based on consultations and interviews with the Muslim community and retired Muslim police officers from across 14 cities and towns in India."

About the speakers:

Devika Prasad and **Ankur Otto** work with the police reform programme of the Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative (CHRI). Devika leads the programme, and Ankur is a project officer. They were part of the joint CHRI-Quill team that worked on the study and report on Muslims perceptions of policing in India.
