


Admissions Open 2025






M.Sc. in Development Studies



Each week, students engage with leading scholars, researchers, and practitioners from around the world who bring deep insights into how development unfolds across diverse regions and contexts.


While central to the M.Sc. program, these Masterclasses are open to the wider university community and the public, offering a rich space for dialogue, critical reflection, and inspiration.




Nazariya: A Critical Dialogue Series

19th August, 4:00 to 5:30 PM






Nazariya: A Critical Dialogue Series

It focuses on representation Muslims the of postcolonial Bollywood, tracing shifts in portrayal over seven decades in response to India's changing socio-political climate. Drawing on empirical data, it explores Muslim film genres, narrative styles, and the politics of representation from both producer and audience perspectives. The existing studies builds on representation in Hindi cinema and offers a significant contribution to debates on ethnic and religious minorities in global popular culture, with particular attention to Bollywood.






