Dr. Chockalingam is currently the Director of the Center for Neuromodulation at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Saint Louis and is an expert in treatment resistant depression, addiction, and neuromodulation, offering intervention psychiatry treatments including repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation and novel treatments such as esketamine for high-risk individuals. Dr. Chockalingam is also teaching faculty at the Department of Neurology, Saint Louis University and an alumni of Madras Medical College and Research Institute in India and Washington University in Saint Louis, MO, where he completed his specialty training in Psychiatry.
