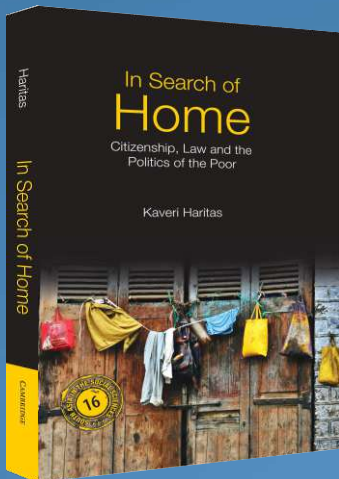

About the Book

In Search of Home explores the new ghettos of urban poverty in India studying rehabilitation housing provided by the state to the displaced poor. This ethnography narrates how the state governs these spaces rendering the citizenship of poor groups in-limbo; the systemic corruption and co-optation of poor groups; and the gendered struggles that in turn shape the governance of these spaces.
