ONE HUNDRED YEARS OF CHILDREN'S RIGHTS -: Child Welfare in Social, Educational and Family Policies

The year 2024 marks the 100th anniversary of the international Geneva Declaration of the Rights of the Child. The declaration stated that 'humanity owes the child the best it has to give.' Since then, policymakers worldwide have approached safeguarding child welfare in different, sometimes controversial, ways. Often, outcomes remained lacking. How did policymakers, teachers, family courts and parents, from the 1920s to the present, address 'the best interest of the child'? This panel discussion engages with this question and discusses child-related policies in different policymaking domains in India, such as social policy, including the politics of social and gender inequality, family law, and education policy.
