Dr. Vidya Subramanian

Associate Professor, Jindal School of Government and Public Policy, JGU

Dr. Vidya Subramanian is an Associate Professor at the Jindal School of Government and Public Policy (JSGP) since 2021. She is a sociologist studying how enterprise cultures shape the governance of public education. Her current research follows consultants and think tanks as they advocate for technology-based and data-driven interventions to reform education. Her areas of expertise include technical education, gender and entrepreneurship, education policy, data and governance.

Anjela Taneja is Lead, Public Services and Inequality lead for Oxfam International. She is the Co-Convenor of the RTE Forum, India's largest education network and had served as Head of Policy at Global Campaign for Education. Prior to this, she was Essential Services Lead for Oxfam India and the Technical Director-Education at CARE India. She also had a short stint in academia working at MS University, Baroda, India.

CEO, Creatnet Education

Jasmeet Walia joined Creatnet Education in 2015 to support the systems work with school principals and teachers across Delhi. She grew as a facilitator and formally took over as the CEO in 2022. She now leads the work with government education systems. Creatnet Education is a network of revolutionary leaders building volunteer-led learning communities in two distinct spaces government education systems and youth and teacher communities. Creatnet Education's work in leadership development currently influences 2,500 government schools and approximately 66,000 teachers and 20 lakh students in Delhi. Prior to joining Creatnet Education, Jasmeet Walia worked for six years in the corporate sector and holds a Master's Degree in International Business from Symbiosis, Pune. She was also a Teach for India Fellow from 2014 to 2016.
