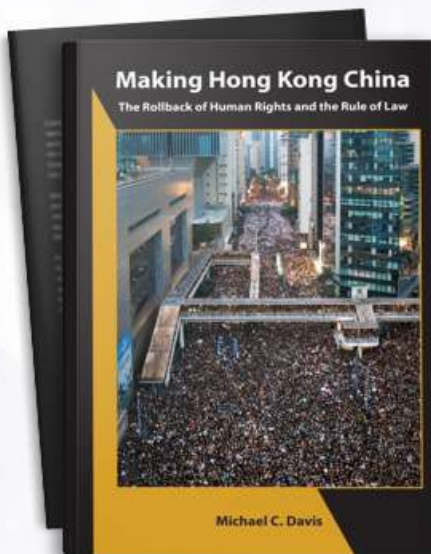

Prof. (Dr.) C. Raj Kumar



Prof. (Dr.) C. Raj Kumar, a Rhodes Scholar, is the Founding Vice Chancellor of O.P. Jindal Global (Institution of Eminence Deemed To Be University) (JGU) in India. He was appointed as the VC at the age of 34 in 2009 when the university was established. JGU is one of only 20 universities in India and the only non-STEM university, which has been declared as an "Institution of Eminence" by the Gov. of India.

Prof. Kumar is an accomplished legal scholar and works in the fields of human rights and development, comparative constitutional law, terrorism and national security, corruption and governance, law and disaster management, legal education and higher education. He has seven books and over hundred and

fifty publications to his credit and has published widely in peer reviewed journals, law reviews in Australia, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Singapore, UK and the USA.

Prof. Kumar has academic qualifications from the University of Oxford, Harvard University, University of Hong Kong, University of Delhi and Loyola College. He served as a faculty member at the School of Law of City University of Hong Kong, where he taught for many years. Prof. Kumar was awarded the Rhodes Scholarship at the University of Oxford, UK, where he obtained his Bachelor of Civil Law (B.C.L.) degree; a Landon Gammon Fellowship at the Harvard Law School, USA, where he obtained his Master of Laws (LL.M.) degree and a James Souverine Gallo Memorial Scholarship at Harvard University. He received the Doctor of Legal Science (S.J.D.) from the University of Hong Kong. He also obtained a Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) degree from the University of Delhi, India; and a Bachelor of Commerce degree from the Loyola College, University of Madras, India.

Prof. (Dr.) Sreeram Chaulia



Prof. (Dr.) Sreeram Chaulia is Professor and Dean at the Jindal School of International Affairs of O.P. Jindal Global (Institution of Eminence Deemed To Be University). He holds a Doctorate (Ph.D.) and a Master of Arts (M.A.) in Political Science and International Relations from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs, Syracuse University, USA. He holds a Master of Science (MSc.) degree in History of International Relations at the London School of Economics and Political Science, UK. He was a Radhakrishnan British Chevening Scholar at the University of Oxford, UK, where he obtained a Bachelor of Arts in Modern History. He also has a Bachelor of Arts Honours from St. Stephen's College, DU, India.

Prof. Chaulia's areas of specialisation include diplomacy, foreign policy, comparative politics, international political economy, international organisations, armed conflict, humanitarian practices, and contemporary world history. He has over eight hundred and ninety publications to his credit. His writings have appeared in journals in the USA, UK, Australia, Canada and India, some of which are Seton Hall Journal of Diplomacy and International Relations; Journal of Refugee Studies, Journal of Humanitarian Assistance, International Politics, World Affairs, International Journal of Peace Studies, South Asia: Journal of South Asian Studies, Economic and Political Weekly, Contemporary South Asia Journal and India Quarterly. Prof. Chaulia is Contributing Editor to the book PEOPLE WHO INFLUENCED THE WORLD OVER THE PAST 100 YEARS (2005), published by Murray Books, Adelaide. His book, MODI DOCTRINE: THE FOREIGN POLICY OF INDIA'S PRIME MINISTER was published in 2016 by Bloomsbury, New York, Sydney, London & New Delhi. His latest book TRUMPED: EMERGING POWERS IN A POST-AMERICAN WORLD has been published in Nov. 2019 by Bloomsbury, New York, Sydney, London & New Delhi.

Prof. Avinash Godbole



Avinash Godbole is Assistant Professor at O. P. Jindal Global University since February 2018. Previously he worked with ICWA and IDSA. His doctoral thesis was on the Political Economy of China's Environment. He was a Visiting Fox Fellow at the Macmillan Center at Yale in 2007-08. His research interests are in the fields of Chinese Foreign Policy, Environmental Changes in China, Minorities in China, Domestic Politics in China, China's Asia strategy and India-China Relations. He has written extensively on these subjects in academic and media publications. He has been part of the India-China Think tank Forum and has been involved in various other track 1.5 and track 2 events. He is also a Visiting Faculty at the Naval War College, Goa.

Prof. Michael C. Davis



Michael C. Davis is in the Fall of 2020 a Visiting Professor in the Faculty of Law Professor at the University of Hong Kong where he teaches core courses on international human rights. He is also a Professor of Law and International Affairs at O.P. Jindal Global University, a Global Fellow at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars in Washington DC, and a Senior Research Scholar at the Weatherhead East Asia Institute at Columbia University. A professor in the Law Faculty at the University of Hong Kong until late 2016, he has held a number of distinguished visiting professorships, including the J. Landis Martin Visiting Professor of Human Rights Law at Northwestern University

(2005-6), the Robert and Marion Short Visiting Professor of Human Rights at the University of Notre Dame (2004-5) and the Frederick K. Cox Visiting Professor of Law at Case Western Reserve University (2000).

His scholarship engages a range of issues relating to human rights, the rule of law and constitutionalism in emerging states, with frequent publication in such widely read public affairs journals as Foreign Affairs and the Journal of Democracy, as well more mainstream academic journals. He has contributed commentary and analysis to such popular media as the Washington Post, the New York Times, Nikkei, Apple Daily and South China Morning Post, the latter for which Amnesty International, the Hong Kong Journalists Association and the Hong Kong FCC awarded him a 2014 Human Rights Press Award for commentary.

Mr. Buddhi Prakash Chauhan is presently the founder Director of Global Library at O. P. Jindal Global University. He is also founder President of Consortium of Private Academic Libraries in India (COPAL). Prior to joining O. P. Jindal Global University, he was the University Librarian at Thapar University Patiala and Senior Information Scientist at Thapar Centre for Industrial Research & Development, Patiala. Mr Chauhan Visited the United States of America in the year 2002-2003 as Fulbright Fellow, and was affiliated with Digital Library Research Laboratory and Information Retrieval, analysis and management Centre (IRAM) at Virginia Tec, Blacksburg. He worked on Community of Practices in Technology Innovations in SMEs. He has also participated in several national and international

conferences and training programmes in India, USA and UK.
