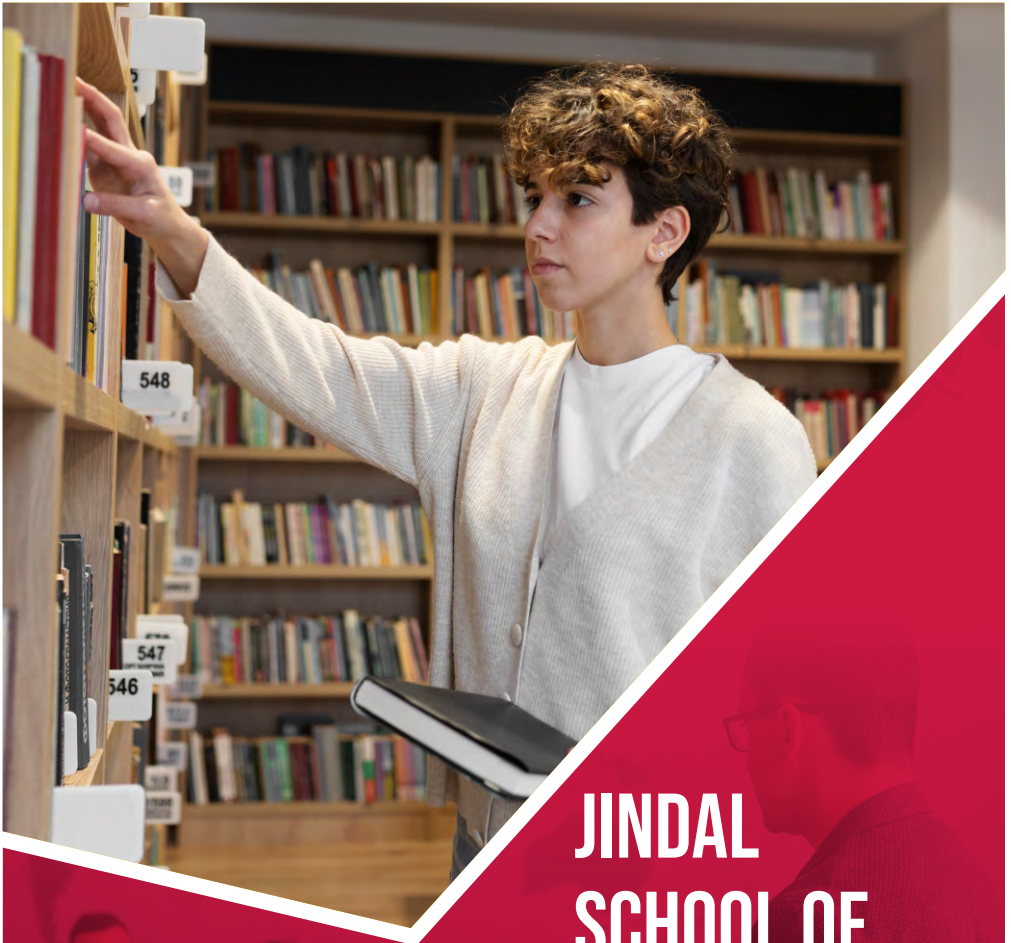

About Jindal School of Languages & Literature



The Jindal School of Languages and Literature (JSLL) is the eleventh school of O. P. Jindal Global University and has been established to encourage innovative research and effectively teach languages, linguistics and literature studies for our present hyper-globalized world, when language learning and intercultural communication are more important to human flourishing and mutual understanding than ever before. Some languages today are shrinking while others are expanding in use and richness. Several languages have expanded their reach to include hundreds of millions of speakers, even in far removed corners of the globe. It is common today to find people in India and elsewhere who are bi- or trilingual, who use a 'global' language as well as regional or local ones. Using several languages is increasingly part of our everyday cultural experience and helps us literally become known to ourselves and to others.

Language and literature programmes matter in today's world because they inculcate essential skills of communication and analysis of the human condition. JSLL promotes learning and research in areas of language, linguistics, literature and cultural studies not in order to separate them from other fields and activities of a university but to create an environment in which cultural legacies and the products of human inventiveness receive due attention. The current programmes under JSLL are part of the first phase of building a school whose activities will help the university develop into a premier institution for learning and research in languages and literature.



Distinctive features of Jindal School of Languages & Literature

- 1** Well qualified faculty educated at the top universities of India and the world. Faculty-including international faculty conduct significant, impactful research and bring their expertise into the classroom to shape students' learning experiences. Low student-to-faculty ratio ensures that each JSLL student gets a lot of attention.
- 2** Multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary courses provide students a rich and varied intellectual experience. As an Institution of Eminence, JGU - JSLL offers courses that conform to University Grants Commission curricular requirements (NEP 2020) and go beyond them.
- 3** JSLL is linked with the JGU Office of English and Foreign Languages which includes the Centre for Foreign Languages, English Language Centre, and the Centre for Writing Studies. The faculty and staff of nearly 30 teach language courses and offer training in research methods and professional writing. The Global Languages Lab provides guided instruction and self-learning tools for English and other languages. The lab features computer work stations, licensed software for language learning, and other resources for study of languages.
- 4** JSLL teaches a variety of courses in addition to those designed for B.A. (Hons.) English: they cover the fields of literary theory, translation studies, Hispanic studies, linguistics, history of material culture, cultural history, intellectual history, and other areas.
- 5** International institutional partnerships for Study Abroad programmes and research networks with global institutions and agencies. Cooperation with cultural institutions in India-foreign language training institutes and research foundations –including Instituto Cervantes, Alliance Française and Institute Française.
- 6** JSLL students have opportunities to engage with student clubs and societies and they may participate in activities of more than a dozen research cells/centres of JGU.
- 7** The JSLL Distinguished Lecture Series and other extracurricular events enable students to engage with eminent scholars and practitioners from India and around the world-scholars, researchers, creative and performing artists, and public figures.
- 8** World-class library resources including extensive online journal collections and digital databases.





About B.A. (Hons.) English

The B.A. (Hons.) English programme is a well-designed curriculum delivered through the Jindal School of Languages and Literature that, first, leads students to mastery of the English language, and second, encourages their intensive engagement with literary and performative cultures expressed in the English language. While 'literature in English' is not the same thing as world literature, the English language is by now arguably the most important medium of world literature. English is the language through which most people in the world today encounter, in translation, the literature and written heritage of the whole world.

As a pre-professional degree, B.A. (Hons.) English opens many doors to personal fulfilment and professional accomplishment. This is because an undergraduate English degree has never been about memorizing fossilized texts and musing over a few pretty words. Studying English is about whole engagement with language as a medium of heritage, the repository of thought and emotion, and the capacity that most defines us as human beings.

Students of the B.A. (Hons.) English programme work closely with dedicated faculty both within JSLL and from other academic units of the university. Programme faculty advise them at every stage of their studies and help them discover their passions. The programme duration for B.A. (Hons.) English is four years (eight semesters) of full time study. Students must complete 196 credits of core courses, subject-specific elective courses, skill-development courses, interdisciplinary elective courses, and other learning activities that include internships, capstone research and writing

projects. The curriculum ensures students' wide and deep engagement with a variety of cultural forms, including literature, drama, cinema and other arts.

Students of the 4-year Honours programme spend their final year following a specialization option in one of the four following study areas: (1) Comparative, Cultural, and Translation Studies; (2) Creative Writing; (3) Professional Communication (4) Gender and Sexuality Studies. Once they choose their specialization stream, students may complete their requirements through a combination of taught courses (elective courses in JSLL and other JGU schools), research methods modules, and writing courses. Students may also choose a full-semester internship engagement or participate in Study Abroad during the final programme year.

B.A. (Hons.) English students benefit from the flexibility afforded by the interdisciplinary organization of the university by completing courses/credits through other programmes and schools. In turn, many courses of the B.A. (Hons.) English programme and JSLL are open to students pursuing other study programmes.

As you immerse yourself in the diverse field of English studies, you and your fellow students will contribute to and even take the lead in campus publications, readings and other activities that shape the collective life of a university. You will challenge and inspire your fellow students and they will do the same for you.

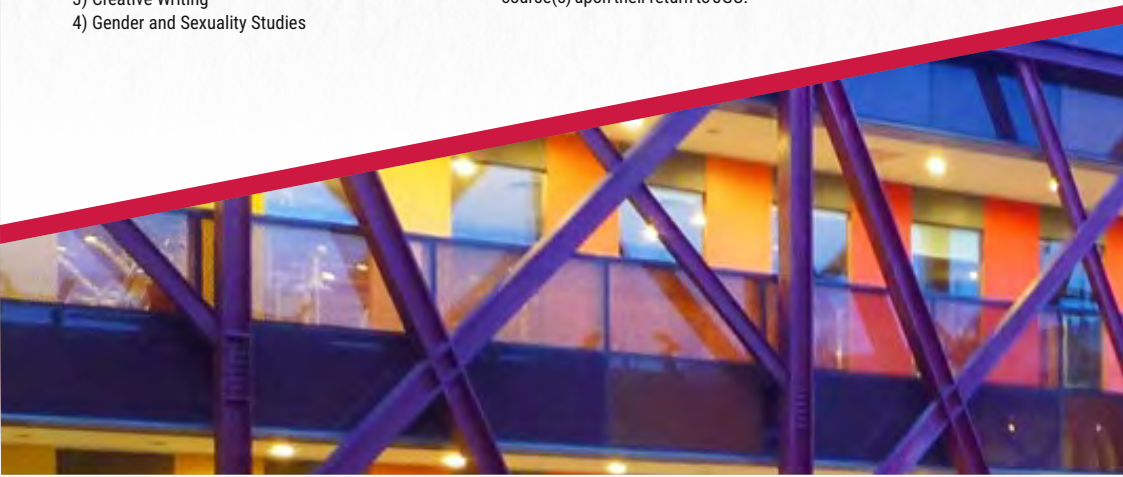
Semester 7 and 8: Specialization Stream Year

Note 1: Changes of sequence can be made under circumstances such as semester-length Study Abroad periods, when a student 'misses' the scheduled offering of a JSLL core course. The student would then complete the 'equivalent' course(s) in the institution they are visiting or complete the necessary core course(s) upon their return to JGU.

Agreement with Spanish Government for Spanish Teaching

The O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) signed a landmark MOU with the Embassy of Spain on 8th March 2022 in New Delhi in the presence of the His Excellency José María Ridao Domínguez, Ambassador, Embassy of Spain and Mr. Alfonso Pérez- Hernández Egart, First Secretary, Embassy of Spain. JGU has now attained the unique distinction of being the only private university in India and part of a select group of less than 12 universities in the Indian subcontinent partnering with the government of Spain for Spanish language teaching. The agreement signed under the auspices of the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID and the Spanish Ministry of External Affairs (MAEC) will be especially beneficial for the Jindal School of Languages and Literature (JSLL), which shall now host a native Spanish language lecturer to teach Spanish language, culture and literature. This long-term academic engagement of a native Spanish faculty member shall immensely benefit students of JSLL as they will partake of a richer and more complete experience of Hispanidad (Hispanicity) on the JGU campus and get to work on finer aspects of language skills

such as pronunciation, communicative and socio-pragmatic competencies. The MOU also substantiates JGU and JSLL's singular commitment to consolidate the study of Hispanic literatures and cultures in India. The MOU signed with the Embassy of Spain is an invaluable addition to the already existing agreements and instruments of cooperation signed by JGU with higher education institutions from Spanish speaking countries. Till date, JGU has established and expanded its presence in the Hispanophone world by entering into 22 agreements with prestigious and eminent higher education institutions such as University of Granada, University of Salamanca, University of Chile, National University of Colombia etc. spread out across Spain and Latin America. Highly qualified JSLL faculty members teach a wide variety of courses in Spanish language, literature and culture. Their courses are open to students of various programmes of the university. JGU learners of Spanish will have plentiful opportunities to learn through linguistic and cultural immersion.

JSLL Distinguished Lecture Series 2022–2025

The ongoing JSLL Distinguished Lecture Series has typically featured talks and presentations by renowned scholars and experts in various fields of study, providing opportunities for intellectual stimulation, networking, and interdisciplinary collaboration. Here are some of lectures organized as part of the JSLL Distinguished Lecture Series:

On **4 September 2024**, JSLL organized a lecture on the “The Translation Process” by **Olga Marino** as part of the “Introduction to Translation” course taught by **Prof. Neus Gimeno**.

On **26 September 2024**, we organized a book talk titled “Everyday Reading: Middlebrow Magazines and Book Publishing in Post-Independence India” by **Dr. Aakriti Mandhwani**, Assoc. Prof of English, Shiv Nadar University. **Dr. Mandhwani** spoke about the ways in which her project charts the journey of evolving reading taste of the Hindi-speaking Indian middle class.

On **1 October 2024**, JSLL, in collaboration with JSIA (Jindal School of International Affairs) and JII (Jindal India Institute), held a book discussion between Ambassador **(Dr.) Jitendra Nath Mishra** in discussion with **Prof. Akshay Kale on Radhaland** and *Worlds Beyond: Poems* by **Ramakanta Rath**.

On **14 October 2024**, we organized a lecture titled “The Body Poetic: Lineages of Modernist Women’s Poetry” by **Dr. Brinda Bose**, Associate Professor, Centre for English Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University. She spoke about the textures of poetic language and its connections to desire.

On **19 March 2025**, we held a book talk on the novel *Great Eastern Hotel* by author **Ruchir Joshi**. The talk delved into questions on narrative composition, dialogue, and the relationships between fiction and history.

On **26 March 2025**, JSLL, in collaboration with JSLH, organized a lecture titled “What’s so Distant about Distant Reading” by **Mr. Samya Brata Roy**, a PhD scholar at the School of Liberal Arts, IIT Jodhpur. This lecture, at the intersection of digital humanities and literary studies, invited students and faculty to rethink the concept of distant reading.

On **10 April 2025**, we organized a session titled led by **Isha Bhatia Sanan**, senior journalist and media expert with **Deutsche Welle**. As part of Deutsche Welle’s outreach programme, #DWGoesToCampus, **Ms. Sanan** introduced its Asia Department, the courses it offers, career opportunities, and the future of journalism from a European perspective.

The JSLL World Cinema Series:

On **29 August 2024**, JSLL organized a JGU exclusive film screening and cine-discussion on *También la lluvia* (Even the Rain) by the **critically acclaimed** Spanish filmmaker **Icíar Bollaín**. Instituto Cervantes, New Delhi, facilitated this exclusive screening.

On **19 September**, JSLL, in collaboration with the **Embassy of El Salvador in India**, organized a JGU exclusive film screening and cine discussion on *El Suspiro del silencio* (The Whisper of Silence), directed by **Alfonso Quijada**.

International Mother Tongue Day Poetry Contest: On the occasion of **International Mother Tongue Day (21 February 2025)**, JSLL organized a poetry-writing contest called "Feelings in My Mother Tongue." The contest was open to all students and faculty members of the university.

Student Internships:

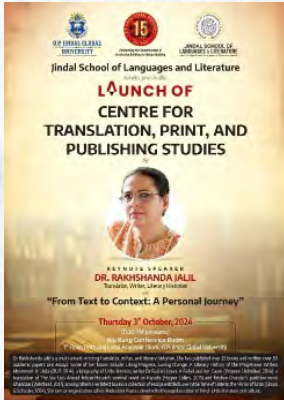

Centre for Translation, Print, and Publishing Studies (CTPPS)



The Centre for Translation, Print, and Publishing Studies (CTPPS) was established in September 2024. It brings together the fields of translation, print culture, and publishing studies: fields that connect communities, preserve histories, and shape our understanding of cultural traditions.



The official launch event on 3 October 2024 featured a keynote address by Dr. Rakhshanda Jalil, a renowned translator, writer, and literary historian. In her address titled “From Text to Context: A Personal Journey,” Dr. Jalil reflected on her extensive experience in the field of translation and shared her insights into the transformative power of words and their contexts. Since then, the Centre has hosted talks and workshops by translators Dr. P. K. Mangalam, Ms. Maria Puri, Mr. Md. Shalim M. Hussain, Mr. Gautam Choubey, and Professor (Dr.) Galina Rousseva-Sokolova (see full list of events below).

The CTPPS management team, led by Director, Professor Denys P. Leighton, includes Professor (Dr.) Galina Rousseva-Sokolova, Ms. Neus Gimeno Gimeno, Dr. Niyati Sharma, Dr. Turni Chakrabarti, and Dr. Samudranil Gupta. The trajectory of the Centre is to become a recognised interdisciplinary space for scholars, practitioners, and students to explore the intersections of oral and literary cultures, engage with contemporary practices of translation and publishing, and study the materiality of print. The Centre intends to explore not only literary translation but translation of commercial, legal, medical, and other texts, and to advance translation practice in non-print media (for example, in dubbing, captioning, subtitling).

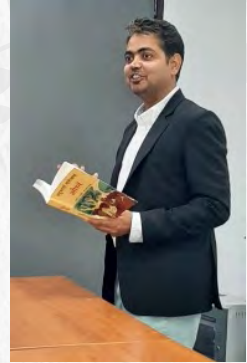
Since its inception, CTPPS has organized the following events:

On 17 October 2024, we organized a lecture titled “The Submissive Craft of Translating from Non-Standard Languages” by Dr. Md Shalim M Hussain. He shared insights from his extensive experience in translating non-standard languages and exploring the nuances and challenges involved in this craft.

On 12 February 2025, we organized a book talk titled "Translating Eduardo Galeano into Hindi: A Cross-Cultural Exploration" by Dr. P.K. Mangalam. He spoke about the process of translating from Spanish into Hindi, shedding light on what makes translation such a demanding yet rewarding endeavor.

On 23rd April 2025, we organized a talk titled "The Poet's Courtesan or the Courtesan's Poet? Translation, Caste and the Bhojpuri Canon" by Dr. Gautam Choubey, an academic, writer, translator, and the host of Sansad TV's talk show on Indian literature, Likhawat. In his talk, he discussed his translations from Bhojpuri (Pandey Kapil's historical romance 'Phoolsunghi') and introduced us to the contours of Bhojpuri literary canon formation.

PhD English Programme

The PhD programme in English Studies has been administratively based and academically anchored in JSLL since 2023. It trains scholars to work in advanced methodologies and to work in an innovative way while responding to developments in the broad area of English Studies and of adjacent fields such as linguistics, comparative literature, translation studies, and cultural studies. Doctoral scholars in this programme benefit from formal teaching, mentoring, and supervision by several dozen research-active JGU faculty. The PhD English programme welcomes scholars, creative practitioners, and in-service educators who aspire to give their work a scholarly grounding. The doctoral programme committee currently has members from JSLL (with the Dean JSLL as Chair), the Jindal Global Law School, the Office of English and Foreign Languages, and the Jindal School of Journalism and Communications. Two doctoral scholars joined the programme in 2024 and four in 2025. For the time being, admission to PhD English happens once in each academic year (May – July). Part-time engagement in the programme is facilitated by longer time periods allowed for course work and completion of a final research plan, but standards of achievement will be no less rigorous than those for full-time scholars.
