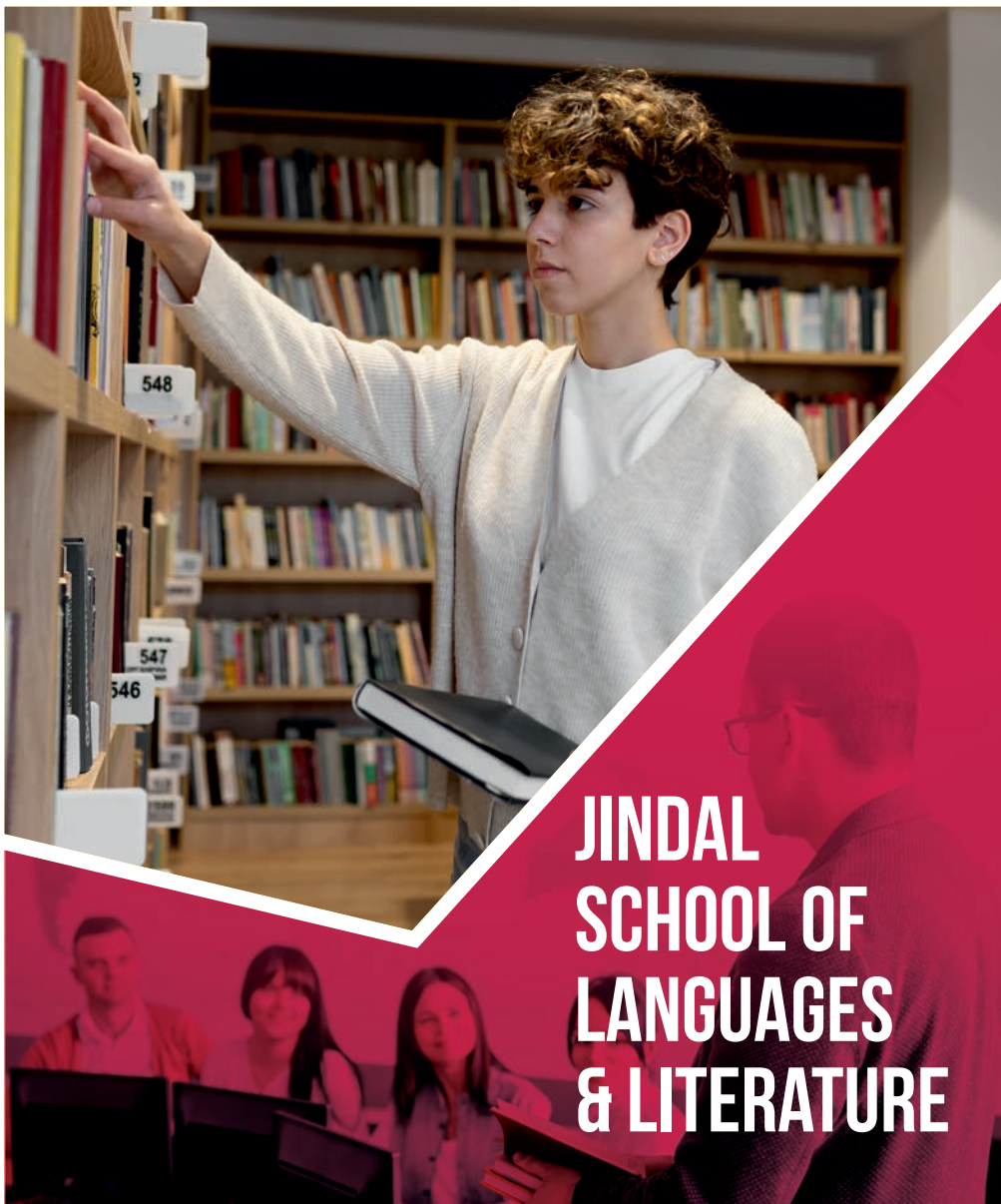

About O.P. Jindal Global University

O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) is a non-profit global university established by the Government of Haryana and recognised by the University Grants Commission (UGC). JGU was established as a philanthropic initiative of its Founding Chancellor, Mr. Naveen Jindal in memory of his father, Mr. O.P. Jindal. JGU is one of the few universities in Asia that maintains a 1:9 faculty-student ratio and appoints faculty members from India and different parts of the world with outstanding academic qualifications and experience. JGU is a research intensive university, which is deeply committed to its core institutional values of interdisciplinary and innovative pedagogy, pluralism, rigorous scholarship and globalism, and international engagement.

JGU has established 12 schools: Jindal Global Law School (JGLS); Jindal Global Business



School (JGBS); Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA); Jindal School of Government and Public Policy (JSGP); Jindal School of Liberal Arts & Humanities (JSLH); Jindal School of Journalism & Communication (JSJC); Jindal School of Art & Architecture (JSAA); Jindal School of Banking & Finance (JSBF); Jindal School of Environment & Sustainability (JSES); Jindal School of Psychology & Counselling (JSPC); Jindal School of Languages & Literature (JSL) and Jindal School of Public Health and Human Development (JSPH). JGU has been granted "autonomy" by the University Grants Commission and the Ministry of Education, Government of India, for receiving the "A" Grade from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). This makes JGU the only private university in the state of Haryana and one of the only two private

universities in India to be given the status of autonomy.

JGU has emerged as India's No. 1 Private University for the third year in a row, according to the QS World University Rankings 2023 and was ranked among the Top 700 universities in the world. We are also among the Top 150 universities globally under the age of 50 years by the QS Young University Rankings 2022. JGU has also been recognised in the Top 500 Universities as per the QS Graduate Employability Rankings 2022.

In September 2019, JGU was selected as an 'Institution of Eminence' (IOE) by the Government of India, making JGU one of only eight private universities in India to be awarded this status.

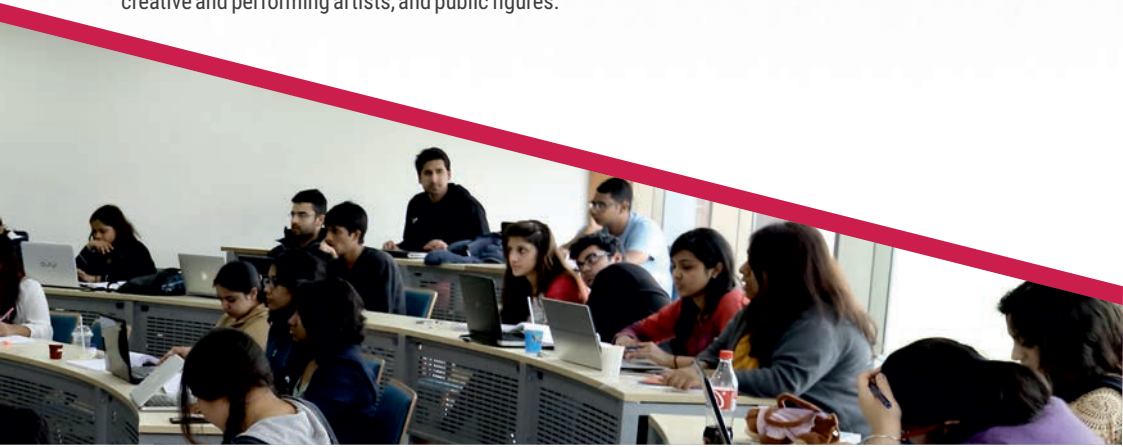
The Jindal School of Languages and Literature (JSLL) is the eleventh school of O. P. Jindal Global University and has been established to encourage innovative research and effectively teach languages, linguistics and literature studies for our present hyper-globalized world, when language learning and intercultural communication are more important to human flourishing and mutual understanding than ever before. Some languages today are shrinking while others are expanding in use and richness. Several languages have expanded their reach to include hundreds of millions of speakers, even in far removed corners of the globe. It is common today to find people in India and elsewhere who are bi- or trilingual, who use a 'global' language as well as regional or local ones. Using several languages is increasingly part of our everyday cultural experience and helps us literally become known to ourselves and to others.


Language and literature programmes matter in today's world because they inculcate essential skills of communication and analysis of the human condition. JSLL promotes learning and research in areas of language, linguistics, literature and cultural studies not in order to separate them from other fields and activities of a university but to create an environment in which cultural legacies and the products of human inventiveness receive due attention. The current programmes under JSLL are part of the first phase of building a school whose activities will help the university develop into a premier institution for learning and research in languages and literature.



Distinctive features of Jindal School of Languages & Literature

- 1** Well qualified faculty educated at the top universities of India and the world. Faculty-including international faculty conduct significant, impactful research and bring their expertise into the classroom to shape students' learning experiences. Low student-to-faculty ratio ensures that each JSLL student gets a lot of attention.
- 2** Multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary courses provide students a rich and varied intellectual experience. As an Institution of Eminence, JGU - JSLL offers courses that conform to University Grants Commission curricular requirements (NEP 2020) and go beyond them.
- 3** JSLL is linked with the JGU Office of English and Foreign Languages which includes the Centre for Foreign Languages, English Language Centre, and the Centre for Writing Studies. The faculty and staff of nearly 30 teach language courses and offer training in research methods and professional writing. The Global Languages Lab provides guided instruction and self-learning tools for English and other languages. The lab features computer work stations, licensed software for language learning, and other resources for study of languages.
- 4** JSLL teaches a variety of courses in addition to those designed for B.A. (Hons.) English: they cover the fields of literary theory, translation studies, Hispanic studies, linguistics, history of material culture, cultural history, intellectual history, and other areas.
- 5** International institutional partnerships for Study Abroad programmes and research networks with global institutions and agencies. Cooperation with cultural institutions in India-foreign language training institutes and research foundations –including Instituto Cervantes, Alliance Française and Institute Française.
- 6** JSLL students have opportunities to engage with student clubs and societies and they may participate in activities of more than a dozen research cells/centres of JGU.
- 7** The JSLL Distinguished Lecture Series and other extracurricular events enable students to engage with eminent scholars and practitioners from India and around the world-scholars, researchers, creative and performing artists, and public figures.
- 8** World-class library resources including extensive online journal collections and digital databases.





About B.A. (Hons.) English

The B.A. (Hons.) English programme is a well-designed curriculum delivered through the Jindal School of Languages and Literature that, first, leads students to mastery of the English language, and second, encourages their intensive engagement with literary and performative cultures expressed in the English language. While 'literature in English' is not the same thing as world literature, the English language is by now arguably the most important medium of world literature. English is the language through which most people in the world today encounter, in translation, the literature and written heritage of the whole world.

As a pre-professional degree, B.A. (Hons.) English opens many doors to personal fulfilment and professional accomplishment. This is because an undergraduate English degree has never been about memorizing fossilized texts and musing over a few pretty words. Studying English is about whole engagement with language as a medium of heritage, the repository of thought and emotion, and the capacity that most defines us as human beings.

Students of the B.A. (Hons.) English programme work closely with dedicated faculty both within JSLL and from other academic units of the university. Programme faculty advise them at every stage of their studies and help them discover their passions. The programme duration for B.A. (Hons.) English is four years (eight semesters) of full time study. Students must complete 190 credits of core courses, subject-specific elective courses, skill - development courses, interdisciplinary elective courses, and other learning activities that include internships and capstone' research and writing

projects. The curriculum ensures students' wide and deep engagement with a variety of cultural forms, including literature, drama, cinema and other arts. There is an exit option at the end of Year 3 for students who complete minimum 144 credits, including a capstone writing project.

Students of the 4-year Honours programme spend their final year pursuing a specialization option in one of the three following study areas: 1) Comparative, Cultural, and Translation Studies 2) Professional Communication 3) Creative Writing 4) Gender and Sexuality Studies. Once they choose their specialization stream, students may complete their requirements through a combination of taught courses (elective courses in JSLL and other JGU schools), research methods modules, and writing courses. Students may also choose a full-semester internship engagement or participate in Study Abroad during the final programme year.

B.A. (Hons.) English students benefit from the flexibility afforded by the interdisciplinary organization of the university by completing courses/credits through other programmes and schools. In turn, many courses of the B.A. (Hons.) English programme and JSLL are open to students pursuing other study programmes.

As you immerse yourself in the diverse field of English studies, you and your fellow students will contribute to and even take the lead in campus publications, readings and other activities that shape the collective life of a university. You will challenge and inspire your fellow students and they will do the same for you.

Note 1: Changes of sequence can be made under circumstances such as semester-length Study Abroad periods, when a student 'misses' the scheduled offering of a JSLL core course. The student would then complete the 'equivalent' course(s) in the institution they are visiting or complete the necessary core course(s) upon their return to JGU.



Programme Elective Courses

This is an indicative list of programme elective courses designed primarily for JSLL students. Most programme electives will be of 3 or 4 credits and students will usually be able to choose from a cluster of available programme electives. Students must also complete cross- electives courses offered through non - JSLL programmes - of at least 18 and as many as 24 credits.

Agreement with Spanish Government for Spanish Teaching

The O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) signed a landmark MOU with the Embassy of Spain on 8th March 2022 in New Delhi in the presence of the His Excellency José María Ridaó Domínguez, Ambassador, Embassy of Spain and Mr. Alfonso Pérez- Hernández Egart, First Secretary, Embassy of Spain. JGU has now attained the unique distinction of being the only private university in India and part of a select group of less than 12 universities in the Indian subcontinent partnering with the government of Spain for Spanish language teaching. The agreement signed under the auspices of the Spanish Agency for International Development Cooperation (AECID and the Spanish Ministry of External Affairs (MAEC) will be especially beneficial for the Jindal School of Languages and Literature (JSLL), which shall now host a native Spanish language lecturer to teach Spanish language, culture and literature. This long-term academic engagement of a native Spanish faculty member shall immensely benefit students of JSLL as they will partake of a richer and more complete experience of Hispanidad (Hispanicity) on the JGU campus and get to work on finer aspects of language skills

such as pronunciation, communicative and socio-pragmatic competencies. The MOU also substantiates JGU and JSLL's singular commitment to consolidate the study of Hispanic literatures and cultures in India. The MOU signed with the Embassy of Spain is an invaluable addition to the already existing agreements and instruments of cooperation signed by JGU with higher education institutions from Spanish speaking countries. Till date, JGU has established and expanded its presence in the Hispanophone world by entering into 22 agreements with prestigious and eminent higher education institutions such as University of Granada, University of Salamanca, University of Chile, National University of Colombia etc. spread out across Spain and Latin America. Highly qualified JSLL faculty members teach a wide variety of courses in Spanish language, literature and culture. Their courses are open to students of various programmes of the university. JGU learners of Spanish will have plentiful opportunities to learn through linguistic and cultural immersion.

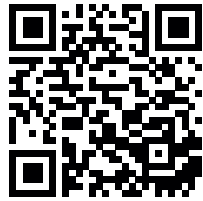
