

Prof. Kaloiya has supervised over 27 Ph. D., DM., MD, and M.Sc. theses, and has authored over 75 research articles. Dr. Kaloiya has been a resource person and a key member of various government committees, including those under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), and has held leadership roles in various professional societies, including the President of the Indian Association of Clinical Psychologists (IACP).


Socio-culturally induced distress among migrant labourers in India: A Qualitative Inquiry

Lecture Brief: The work revolves around exploring the experiences of distress among Indian migrant labourers with the help of qualitative research. Findings indicate that the essence of the migrant labourers' distress is largely rooted in their culturally defined roles, prevailing socio-cultural norms, legal and other structural factors.



Harnessing the Power of Climate Activism: A psychological perspective

Lecture Brief: Dr. Akancha Srivastava presented a review of psychological research on climate change and climate activism. The talk highlighted trends in climate change research over time and across different regions. She examined the meaning and understanding of key research themes pertaining to the area of climate change. She provided insights into the psychological factors that drive climate activism and suggest strategies for encouraging broader participation in efforts to combat climate change.



Job Demand Resource Model of Psychological Capital

Lecture Brief: Dr. Kannu Priya discussed about the antecedents of Psychological Capital in Indian IT Industry, based on one of the most recent theoretical paradigms of occupational health, that is, Job Demand Resource Model. Lecture Brief: The prevalence of mental disorders appears to be more among certain populations given their vulnerable situation. Vulnerable populations, including socioeconomically disadvantaged individuals, ethnic minorities, migrants, and those experiencing homelessness, face heightened risks of mental health issues. In India tribal communities, slum residents, and transgender individuals among others, face significant mental health challenges due to socioeconomic disadvantages, stigma, and limited access to healthcare. Adding to this vulnerable population are young people who experience extreme climate change events. This lecture will showcase studies and discuss specific issues while conducting mental health research among some marginalized populations in India.



and the Centre for Neurodiversity and Development at Durham University, for partnering with us.




