Dillipoetry is a literary platform dedicated to de-pedestalizing poetry: making it accessible, experiential and embodied. Over the past three years, Dillipoetry has curated and hosted more than 80+ poetry walks, workshops and training programmes on themes such as religious unity and coexistence, the climate emergency, queer ecology & intimacies, poetry of resistance, romanticism, feminist architecture, neurodivergence, and our relationship with the natural world.

In this time, Dillipoetry has cultivated an intimate community of over 200 local city poets, creating spaces of beauty, reflection, and dialogue—spaces where poetry becomes a way of witnessing, questioning and reimagining the world.

At the heart of their work lies a recurring inquiry: What does it mean to be human in this time, age and crises? Through poetry, we seek not only to articulate this question but to live it, together!
