




The September sessions brought together a remarkable line-up of global scholars and thought leaders who offered fresh insights into pressing issues of development, economy, and democracy:




## **Artisanal Alchemy**

The Reading Circle is a vibrant space that invites students to read, reflect, and engage in meaningful discussions on a wide range of texts.





The threat to india's sea coasts and coastal livelihoods



# Reading Texts in Social Sciences: A Collaborative Initiative by I.D.E.A.S. and the Kashf Initiative



This initiative is part of I.D.E.A.S.' ongoing efforts to engage young minds through courses and programs that blend theory, fieldwork, and methodological training.


